Renton - the center of healthcare

We all know Renton as the home of Boeing and the Seattle Seahawks. But did you know that Renton is also leading the way when it comes to healthcare providers? For many years we've been a leader in local healthcare through the outstanding work of UW Medicine/Valley Medical Center. Recently, one of the nation's top providers of healthcare — Providence Health & Services, which is headquartered in Renton — merged with California-based St. Joseph Health, making it the third-largest nonprofit health system in the United States. Providence currently has 2,500 employees at its 12-acre Renton campus near IKEA. They have a strong commitment to charity and in 2015, Providence nationally contributed \$949 million to charity care and uncompensated services and that amount will rise to \$1.4 billion.

Last year, Group Health broke ground for their new operations facility and corporate campus at the former Longacres site. It will include three office buildings and a pharmaceutical distribution center and will bring more than 1,300 new jobs to Renton. Group Health is merging with Kaiser-Permanente and will become one of the largest healthcare providers in the nation.

"Photogrammetry" creates 3D images several times more detailed than those produced by hand-held equipment. The system saves the department countless man-hours and allows them to re-open areas under investigation much more quickly.
